

UNIT 1 Vocabulary Words: "Kindness!"

These are the vocabulary words we are studying for our "Kindness" Unit. I usually introduce the new words on Monday and Tuesday, and we often have a quiz on Thursday or Friday to make sure the students are able to use the words in context.

	thoughtful	being kind and caring toward other people
	feelings	plural of feeling: an emotion, such as joy, fear, sadness
	share	to divide into portions and give to others as well as to oneself
	precious	loved and cherished
	care	to look after
	kind	gentle, giving, and friendly
1.2- "For the Love of Our Earth"		
	respect	to be kind and caring toward somebody or something
	dawn	the time each morning at which daylight first begins
	engines	plural of engine: a machine that uses energy to run other machines
	glows	shines
	witness	to see or hear something
	litter	scattered paper or other materials; trash
1.3- "The Elves and the Shoemaker"		
	helpful	providing or willing to provide assistance, information, or other aid
	elves	plural of elf: a type of fairy
	shoemaker	someone who makes shoes
	flash	an instant
	leather	material made from the skin of an animal
	finest	nicest
1.4- "The Lion and the Mouse"		
	sympathy	the ability to feel and understand the sorrow or troubles of others
	snoozing	taking a quick nap
	furios	very angry
	repay	to pay or give back
	raged	past tense of rage: to act violently
	gnaw	to chew
1.5- "Corduroy"		
	grateful	full of thanks for a favor or for something that makes you happy
	palace	a large, fancy house
	escalator	moving stairs
	dashing	running suddenly
	yanked	past tense of yank: to pull
	fastened	past tense of fasten: to button

The words in **bold** are "Concept" Words that we focus on all week. The remainder of the words are from the weekly story/selection.
